The people have a God given right to have and carry weapons for use as self-defense, hunting, sport, or any other lawful purpose. Our Founding Fathers and the people of our great Nation at the time of the adoption of the second amendment recognized this right and the value of it in order to stay free. In so, they sought to limit not only the government but also anyone else from violating that right. They also knew that they might need a well-trained militia in the future to

ward off oppression and tyranny. By adopting the second amendment, they would guarantee that the people would not be obstructed from possessing and carrying weapons and that this Nation would remain free.
